

*“In order to ensure a minimum standard of currency in critical skill sets, Instructors and Coaches are required to maintain annual currency activities as outlined in each rating section (PIM 1 7.1 through 7.8). In addition, holders of a rating are required to **review the unusual situations section(s)**, where applicable, of the associated reference manual as part of ongoing currency and professional development. Verification of currency will be completed through the Annual Rating Revalidation Form, to be signed by an SSE.”*

Below are some examples of unusual situations that rating holders should review in the associated reference manuals:
