Item #1 Airtec Service Bulletin #C2 0113

Airtec as has issued a service bulletin pertaining to the potential failure of a small number of Cypres 2s that become "non-responsive" after being turned on. The affected units were manufactured between February 2009 through December 2012 (02/2009 – 12/2012).

Actions to be taken: Prior to each jump, during your pre-boarding equipment check (after the Cypres has been turned on), perform the following systems test:

Click the control unit push button one time, and watch the red LED light to flash. A flash indicates that the unit is working properly. If the LED does not flash, repeat the procedure to confirm. **If the unit is not responding it is not in a safe working condition, and the unit will not function as intended on a jump.** Refer to the Airtec safety bulletin link below and follow the directions from the manufacturer.
